WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE CLASS

JUNE 12, 2024 EXODUS 8:16-19

INTRODUCTION:

- 1. The ten plagues put the power of God on display as He makes Himself know to Pharaoh with a "strong hand" (Ex. 3.19,20; 6.1)
- 3. The third plague: Frogs on the land
 - a) The magicians were unable to remove them. (Ex. 8.8)
 - b) God killed all the frogs on the land "and the land stank" (cf. Ex. 7.21).
 - c) Pharaoh hardened his heart "when Pharaoh saw that there was relief" (Ex. 8.15).

I. BREAKING DOWN THE TEXT

- A. The third plague: Lice (gnats)
 - 1. **Exodus 8.16:** "strike the dust of the land, so that it may become lice"
 - 2. Moses and Aaron did not go to Pharaoh with an ultimatum. (cf. Ex. 8.1,2)
 - 3. Lice (ken): Literally, gnats (esv). Only found six times. (Ex. 8.16-18; Ps. 105.31)
 - a) Probably a specific species of gnat known as sciniphes.
 - b) These gnats had a painful sting and were attracted to carbon dioxide causing them to be attracted to the nose, mouth, and eyes.
 - 4. **Exodus 8.17:** "All the dust of the land became lice"
 - a) Consider the magnitude of this plague. (Gen. 13.16; Isa. 40.12)
 - b) No plague was inflicted on a small scale. (Ex. 7.19; 8.3; 8.18)
 - c) Just as the water of the Nile was defiled, so it was with the soil of the land.
- B. The failed attempt of the Egyptian magicians.
 - 1. **Exodus 8.18:** "Now the magicians so worked with their enchantments to bring forth lice, but they could not." (Ex. 7.11; 7.22; 8.7)
 - a) Enchantments: Literally, secret mutterings. It refers to incantations.
 - b) This is the last time we read about the magicians trying to replicate the plagues.
 - 2. **Exodus 8.19:** "This is the finger of God."
 - a) Not from the Lord, but from God. Elohim: generic for deity.
 - b) The Egyptians saw God as one of many. (Ex. 18.11; 1 Sam. 4.5-8; 5.2-5)
 - c) Yet there is just one God. (Deut. 4.32-35)
 - 3. **Exodus 8.19:** "But Pharaoh's heart grew hard, and he did not heed them, just as the LORD had said."

II. BRINGING IT HOME

- A. God wants to be known as the only God.
 - 1. The purpose of the ten plagues was twofold.
 - a) It was to make God known to the world. (Ex. 7.17; 8.10; Ex. 15.14,15; Lev. 10.3)
 - b) It was to prove to Israel that "the Lord Himself is God" (Deut. 4.32-35; 7.17,18).
 - 2. Do you direct people's attention to God? (Matt. 5.14-16; cf. 6.1,2)
- B. God wants to be our exclusive help.
 - 1. Through the ten plagues, God is showing His care for His people. (Ex. 3.7,16; 4.31)
 - 2. He did not leave Moses to face Pharaoh on his own. (Ex. 4.12)
 - 3. In our lives, do we turn to God for help? (Isa. 45.22; 47.9-12; Hos. 11.8,9)
- C. God expects our exclusive attention. (Ex. 20.4-6)
