AUGUST 14, 2024 EXODUS 12

INTRODUCTION:

- 1. The historical records of the Old Testament "were written for our learning" (Rom. 15.4).
 - a) The global flood teaches us about the role of baptism. (1 Pet. 3.21)
 - b) The sins of Israel were recorded "for our admonition" (1 Cor. 10.6,11).
 - c) The day of atonement was "was symbolic for the present time" (Heb. 9.9).
- 2. The Passover was a significant event in Israel's history that has lasting meaning for us.

I. THE SACRIFICE OF ISRAEL

- A. The children of Israel were to offer a sacrificial lamb.
 - 1. **Exodus 12.3:** "Every man shall take for himself a lamb."
 - 2. It was to be a lamb without blemish. (Ex. 12.5)
 - 3. The lamb was to be slain. (Ex. 12.6)
- B. Jesus is the sacrificial lamb. (John 1.36)
 - 1. Jesus is a "lamb without blemish and without spot" (1 Pet. 1.19; Heb. 7.26; 1 John 3.5)
 - a) Jesus "knew no sin" (2 Cor. 5.21). He did not experience sin. (cf. Matt. 4.1-11)
 - b) Yet He was "made to be sin." (2 Cor. 5.21; Isa. 53.6,11)
 - 2. **ISAIAH 53.7:** "He was led as a lamb to the slaughter" (cf. Rev. 5.6,9; Acts 3.13-15)

II. THE SALVATION OF ISRAEL

- A. The blood of the lamb was the source of Israel's salvation.
 - 1. **EXODUS 12.7:** "And they shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and on the lintel of the houses where they eat it." (Ex. 12.21,22)
 - 2. The purpose of the blood. (Ex. 12.13,23)
- B. The blood of Jesus is the source of our salvation. (John 1.29)
 - 1. Blood is the source of life. (Lev. 17.10-12)
 - 2. **Hebrews 9.22:** "without shedding of blood there is no remission."
 - 3. **1 PETER 1.18,19:** "the precious blood of Jesus" (cf. 1 John 1.7)

III. THE SUPPER OF ISRAEL

- A. The children of Israel were to partake in a feast.
 - 1. What were they to eat? (Ex. 12.8)
 - 2. How were they to eat it? (Ex. 12.9)
 - 3. When were they to eat it? (Ex. 12.10)
 - 4. Why were they to eat it?
 - a) The children of Israel were in a hurry. (Ex. 12.11)
 - b) The Passover was a memorial. (Ex. 12.14,26,27)
- B. Christians are to partake of a feast.
 - 1. What are we to eat?
 - a) **1 CORINTHIANS 11.20:** They were feasting and calling it the Lord's Supper.
 - b) 1 CORINTHIANS 11.21,22: "One is hungry and another is drunk" Lit. full.
 - c) 1 CORINTHIANS 11.23-26: The proper emblems.
 - 2. How are we to eat it?
 - a) **1 CORINTHIANS 11.27-29:** "But let a man examine himself"
 - b) 1 CORINTHIANS 11,30-32: Not eating properly causes spiritual sickness and death.
 - 3. When are we to eat it?
 - a) **1 CORINTHIANS 11.33:** "When you come together to eat..." (vs. 17,18; cf. Acts 20.7)
 - b) **1 CORINTHIANS 11.33,34:** "Wait for one another."
 - 4. Why are we to eat it? (1 Cor. 11.24,25)
