# WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE CLASS

### JANUARY 1, 2025 EXODUS 18:1-12

#### INTRODUCTION:

- 1. The defeat of the Amalekites came through brethren showing support.
  - a) **EXODUS 17.12:** "And Aaron and Hur supported his hands, one on one side, and the other on the other side; and his hands were steady until the going down of the sun."
  - b) Temptations, hardships, relationships, can make life hard. But we can be steady in the faith when we stand by each other's side and support one another. (1 Thess. 5.14)
- 2. Exodus 18 draws our attention to a conversation between Moses and Jethro.
  - a) Exodus 18.1: "And Jethro" Appears ten times. Also known as Reuel (Ex. 2.18)
  - b) Exodus 18.1: "the priest of Midian" Descendant of Abraham. (Gen. 25.2; cf. Heb. 5.1)
  - c) **Exodus 18.1:** "Moses' father-in-law" (Ex. 2.15-21; 3.1)

### I. JETHRO AND MOSES MEET

- A. The reason for their meeting.
  - 1. Reason #1: He came because of what he heard.
    - a) **Exodus 18.1:** "And Jethro...heard of all that God had done for Moses and for Israel His people—that the LORD had brought Israel out of Egypt."
    - b) How did Jethro hear about Israel's deliverance? (Ex. 15.14,15; Num. 14.13,14)
    - c) The works of God were intended to be public knowledge. (Ex. 9.16)
  - 2. Reason #2: He came to reunite the family of Moses.
    - a) Exodus 18.2: "Then Jethro, Moses' father-in-law, took Zipporah, Moses' wife"
    - b) **Exodus 18.3,4:** The composition of the family of Moses. (cf. Ex. 2.21,22)
    - c) "...after he had sent her back" (Ex. 18.2; cf. 4.24-26)
- B. The location of their meeting.
  - 1. **EXODUS 18.5,6:** "in the wilderness, where he was encamped at the mountain of *God*." The mountain of God was a reference to Mount Sinai. (cf. Ex. 3.1)
  - 2. This was a passage taken out of chronological order. (Ex. 19.1,2; Deut. 1.6,9-13)
  - 3. Why did Jethro meet with Moses at the mountain? (Ex. 3.12; Ex. 18.1)

## II. MOSES AND JETHRO PRAISE GOD

- A. The initial conversation between Moses and Jethro.
  - 1. They expressed concern for each other. (Ex. 18.7)
  - 2. Consider the topic of their conversation.
    - a) **Exodus 18.8:** "all that the LORD had done to Pharaoh and to the Egyptians"
    - b) **Exodus 18.8:** "all the hardship that had come upon them on the way, and how the LORD had delivered them."
  - 3. Consider how Jethro reacted to the news.
    - a) **Exodus 18.9:** "Then Jethro rejoiced for all the good which the LORD had done"
    - b) **Exodus 18.10:** "And Jethro said, 'Blessed by the LORD"
    - c) **Exodus 18.11:** "Now I know that the LORD is greater than all the gods"
    - d) **Exodus 18.12:** "Then Jethro...took a burnt offering and other sacrifices to offer to God." As a priest who served other gods, this was a significant change.
- B. Our conversations with our family can have a powerful influence.
  - 1. Our family is where we will have the most impact. (Acts 10.24,33; 1 Pet. 3.1,2)
  - 2. How often do we talk about God and what He has done in our lives?
    - a) **ZECHARIAH 8.23:** "Let us go with you, for we have heard that God is with you."
    - b) Brethren praised God after hearing of Saul's conversion. (Gal. 1.23,24)
    - c) Does your family see the hope that is in you? (1 Pet. 3.15)
  - 3. How we live is important, but it is also important what we say. (Matt. 12.33-37)
