WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE CLASS JANUARY 8, 2025 Exodus 18:13FF

INTRODUCTION:

- 1. Jethro came to Moses bringing his family and making a declaration.
 - a) **EXODUS 18.11:** "Now I know that the Lord is greater than all the gods"
 - b) This is the message God wanted conveyed. (Ex. 9.14)
 - c) What prompted Jethro to make such a declaration? (Ex. 18.8; cf. Acts 10.24,33)
- 2. Spending time with Moses, Jethro felt compelled to offer his advice.

I. THE CONTEXT

- A. There is an observation. (Ex. 18.13,14)
 - 1. EXODUS 18.13: "Moses sat to judge the people" Literally, decide.
 - a) Judge: Literally, to decide. Moses decided in cases of dispute. (v. 15)
 - b) **ExoDUS 18.13:** "people stood before Moses from morning until evening."
 - 2. **EXODUS 18.14:** *"So when Moses' father-in-law saw all that he did for the people."* Jethro saw with his eyes and came to a realization.
- B. There is a question.
 - 1. **ExoDUS 18.14:** "What is this thing that you are doing for the people?"
 - a) Jethro did not question his motives, methods, or message.
 - b) ExoDUS 18.14: "Why do you alone sit..."
 - 2. Exodus 18.15,16: Moses answers Jethro's questions.
 - a) **EXODUS 18.15:** *"Because the people come to me to inquire of God."*
 - b) **EXODUS 18.16:** *"When they have a difficulty"* Literally, a word.
 - c) **ExoDUS 18.16:** *"the statues of God and His laws"* (cf. Rom. 5.12,13)
- C. There is a criticism.
 - 1. **EXODUS 18.17:** *"The thing that you do is not good."* Literally, beneficial.
 - 2. ExoDUS 18.18: "Both you and these people who are with you..."
 a) Doing too much hurts you and the people you serve. (Mark 3.5; 8.11,12)
 b) Dearly used time to wat from the ine walk. (Mark 4.5)
 - b) People need time to rest from their work. (Mark 6.31)
 - 3. Exodus 18.18: "you are not able to perform it by yourself."

II. THE COUNSEL

- A. He counselled Moses to seek God's counsel. (Ex. 18.19,20)
 - 1. **EXODUS 18.19:** *"Stand before God for the people"* A mediator.
 - 2. Exodus 18.19: "so that you may bring the difficulties to God." A prophet.
 - 3. EXODUS 18.20: A teacher in three ways. (cf. 2 Tim. 3.16,17)
 - a) An instructor: "And you shall teach them the statutes and the laws"
 - b) A counselor: "and show them the way in which they must walk"
 - c) A guide: "and the work they must do."
- B. He counselled Moses to delegate.
 - 1. EXODUS 18.21: "Moreover you shall select from all the people able men"
 - a) Men who feared God. Those who respected His authority.
 - b) Men of integrity. Those who would judge without bias.
 - c) Men who hated covetousness. Those who would judge with pure motives.
 - 2. EXODUS 18.22: "but every small matter they themselves shall judge"
 - 3. Exodus 18.23: "If you do this thing..."
