### WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE CLASS JANUARY 15, 2025 Exodus 19:1-9

### **INTRODUCTION:**

- 1. Exodus 19 begins a new stage in the development of Israel as the people of God. (Ex. 19.5,6)
- 2. The dramatic appearance and interaction with Israel carried two purposes.
  - a) God wanted Israel to listen to Moses and His spokesman. (Ex. 19.9)
  - b) God wanted Israel to be afraid of God. (E. 20.20)
- 3. EXODUS 19.1,2: The time and location of this event.
  - a) EXODUS 19.1: It was exactly two months from the time they left Egypt till Sinai. (cf. Ex. 33.1-4)
  - b) **EXODUS 19.2:** "For they had departed from Rephidim..." (cf. Ex. 16.1; 17.1)

## I. A PROPOSAL IS OFFERED

- A. God speaks to Moses on Mount Sinai.
  - 1. EXODUS 19.3: "And Moses went up to God, and the LORD called to him from the mountain"
  - 2. Who spoke to Moses and then later to Israel?
    - a) God spoke directly to Moses from heaven. (Ex. 19.9,19; 20.1,19,22)
    - b) They saw no form but heard only His voice. (Deut. 4.12,15)
    - c) Yet it was not God, but His representative. (Acts 7.38; Heb. 2.1,2; Gal. 3.19)
- B. The proposal that God offered to Israel.
  - 1. Credentials: God reminds them of what they saw.
    - a) Punishment. EXODUS 19.4: "You have seen what I did to the Egyptians" (cf. Deut. 4.32-36,39)
    - b) Deliverance. **EXODUS 19.4:** "how I bore you on eagles' wings..." (cf. Deut. 32.11,12)
    - c) The same powerful God offers salvation to all of humanity. (1 Thess. 1.5; Eph. 1.17-20)
  - 2. Conditions: God's covenant was conditioned on obedience.
    a) EXODUS 19.5: "Now therefore, if you will indeed obey My voice and keep My covenant"
    b) Our relationship with God is conditioned on obedience. (1 John 2.3; Heb. 5.9)
  - 3. Chosen: God would choose Israel to be His people.
    - a) **EXODUS 19.5,6:** "then you shall be a special treasure to Me above all people"
    - b) Why did God choose Israel? Because "all the earth is Mine" (Deut. 4.7-9; 7.6-8; 9.4-6; 10.14,15)
    - c) Faithful Christians are chosen by God to be His special people. (1 Pet. 2.9)

## **II. A PROPOSAL IS ACCEPTED**

- A. Moses speaks to the children of Israel.
  - 1. EXODUS 19.7: "So Moses... laid before them all these words which the LORD commanded him."
  - 2. Serving God and being His people is a choice.
    - a) No one is ever forced to serve God. (Josh. 24.15; Deut. 30.19; Isa. 56.4-7)
    - b) Israel often made the wrong choice. (Ezek. 33.11; cf. Acts 13.46; 2 Cor. 5.20,21)
- B. Israel accepted the proposal.
  - 1. It was a unanimous decision. **EXODUS 19.8:** "Then all the people answered together."
  - 2. It was an inclusive decision. EXODUS 19.8: "All that the LORD has spoken we will do."
    - a) Were any of God's commands optional? (Deut. 5.32,33; 27.26; James 1.10-12)
    - b) Yet God anticipated Israel's rebellion. (Ex. 24.3,7; Deut. 5.27-29).

# **III. THE COVENANT WAS DELIVERED THROUGH MEDIATION**

- A. Moses was the chosen spokesman for God.
  - 1. **EXODUS 19.9:** "Behold, I come to you in the thick cloud, that the people may hear when I speak with you, and believe you forever." Through a powerful display of God's presence, God testified of Moses.
  - 2. Moses had a special relationship with God as the mediator to His people. a) God speke to Moses face to face. (Fr. 22.11; New 12.6.8)
    - a) God spoke to Moses face to face. (Ex. 33.11; Num. 12.6-8)
    - b) How can God speak to Moses directly, yet no one has seen His face? (1 Tim. 6.16)
- B. Jesus is the chosen spokesman for God today.
  - 1. God testified of Jesus through "miracles, wonders, and signs" (Acts 2.22; John 20.30,31)
  - 2. As the Son of God, Jesus is His spokesman. (Heb. 1.1-3; 2.3)
  - 3. Jesus has seen the face of God. (John 1.18; 6.46)
  - 4. Therefore, we are to listen to Jesus. (Matt. 17.5)
