## WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE CLASS EXODUS 12:29-42 AUGUST 28, 2024

## **INTRODUCTION:**

- 1. Context: Exodus 12 is the chapter that teaches us about the Passover.
  - a) **EXODUS 12:1-20:** God talks to Moses and Aaron.
  - b) ExoDUS 12.21-28: Moses and Aaron talk to Israel.
- 2. The children of Israel were required to observe the Passover.
  - a) **NUMBERS 9.12:** "According to all the ordinances of the Passover they shall keep it."
  - b) NUMBERS 9.13: "But..." What were the circumstances which exempted them?
  - c) Notice the attitude: "he may still keep the LORD'S Passover" (Num. 9.9,10)
  - d) Is missing services a delight or a disappointment? (Heb. 10.24,25)

## I. THE PASSAGE

- A. The tenth plague: The death of the firstborn.
  - 1. The time of the plague. **EXODUS 12.29:** "And it came to pass at midnight"
  - 2. The extent of the plague. **EXODUS 12.29:** "the LORD struck all the firstborn"
    - a) The house of Pharaoh, the slave in the dungeon, and the livestock. (v. 29,30)
    - b) **EXODUS 12.30:** *"there was not a house where there was not one dead."*
    - c) The one who caused mourning among the Israelites now mourned. (Ex. 1.22)
  - 3. It was likely the death only of those who did not have children. (cf. Ex. 13.15)
- B. The reaction to the plague.
  - 1. The reaction of Pharaoh.
    - a) **EXODUS 12.31:** 'Then he called for Moses at night."
    - b) **EXODUS 12.31,32:** He granted their unconditional freedom. (Ex. 8.28; 10.9,10,24)
    - c) Pharaoh drove them out of the land. (Ex. 11.1; 12.39)
    - d) **EXODUS 12.32:** *"Bless me also."* Culturally, it was a common courtesy.
  - 2. The reaction of the Egyptians.
    - a) **EXODUS 12.33:** They urged them to leave in haste. (cf. Ps. 105.38; Ex. 12.39)
    - b) **EXODUS 12.35,36:** They gave Israel gold, silver, and clothing. (cf. Ex. 3.21,22)
- C. The exodus of Israel.
  - 1. EXODUS 12.37,38: They traveled to Succoth. (cf. Gen. 33.17)
  - 2. **EXODUS 12.39:** They left in haste without baking bread.
  - 3. **EXODUS 12.40-42:** Four hundred and thirty years of slavery ended.

## **II. THE PRINCIPLE**

- A. Five things that God predicted.
  - 1. Slavery: Israel would be in slavery. (Gen. 15.13; Ex. 12.40)
  - 2. Stubbornness: Pharaoh would not let Israel go. (Ex. 7.4; 5.2)
  - 3. Severity: Israel would be saved with a strong hand. (Ex. 3.20; 6.1,6; Deut. 4.34)
  - 4. Spoils: Israel would plunder Egypt. (Ex. 3.21,22; Ex. 12.36)
  - 5. Service: Israel would serve God at Mount Sinai. (Ex. 3.12; 19.3,4)
- B. God is in the know.
  - 1. GENESIS 15.13,14: "Know certainly" Slavery, Judgment, Freedom
    - a) **GENESIS 15.13:** "they will afflict them four hundred years."
    - b) **GENESIS 15.14:** "And also the nation whom they serve I will judge"
    - c) **GENESIS 15.14:** "afterward they shall come out with great possessions."
  - 2. Centuries before Jesus was born God predicted His birth. (Matt. 2.17,23; John 1.45)
  - 3. How much does God know about your life? (Luke 12.6,7)
- C. God is in control. (Ex. 3.20,21)
