## WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE CLASS JULY 10, 2024 EXODUS 10.1-11

## INTRODUCTION:

- 1. With the severe hailstorm, Pharaoh called Moses and acknowledged his sin.
  - a) **Exodus 9.27:** "I have sinned this time." Why did Pharaoh repent? (2 Cor. 7.10)
  - b) **Exodus 9.30:** "I know that you will not yet fear the LORD God" Lit., respect. How did Moses know? (v. 35).
  - c) **EXODUS 9.34:** "And when Pharaoh saw that the rain, the hail, and the thunder had ceased, he sinned yet more" (cf. Isa. 57.11; Jer. 48.11)
- 2. Exodus 10.1-20 directs our attention to the seventh plague: Locusts

## I. THE PURPOSE OF THESE PLAGUES REVEALED

- A. We do not always know why God does what He does.
  - 1. God's revelation is complete but limited.
    - a) We have everything we need to know. (2 Tim. 3.16,17; 2 Pet. 1.3)
    - b) We do not have everything we want to know. (Acts 1.7; 1 Pet. 1.10-12)
  - 2. Not knowing leads us to speculate. (Job 6.24; 10.2)
- B. Through these plagues, God would make Himself known to Pharaoh.
  - 1. **Exodus 10.1:** "...that I may show these signs of Mine before Him"
  - 2. These signs were designed to give Pharaoh a chance to change. (Ex. 9.15,16)
- C. Through these plagues, God would make Himself known to future generations.
  - 1. **Exodus 10.2:** "that you may tell in the hearing of your son and your son's son"
  - 2. The children of Israel were to teach their descendants. (Ex. 13.8,9; Deut. 6.20-22)
  - 3. Who is responsible for teaching future generations? (Eph. 6.4)
    - a) The consequence of failing to teach our children. (Judges 2.10)
    - b) Children still make their own choices. (Ezek. 18.10-13)
- D. Through these plagues, God would make Himself known to Moses.
  - 1. **Exodus 10.2:** "that you may know that I am the LORD."
  - 2. Why did Moses need to know that God is the LORD? (Ex. 3.14,15; 5.22,23)
  - 3. Though we know, the word of God needs to be reenforced. (2 Pet. 1.12)

## II. THE PROMISE TO BRING LOCUSTS INTO THE LAND

- A. Moses and Aaron come to Pharaoh with a message.
  - 1. Through Moses, God poses a question.
    - a) **Exodus 10.3:** "How long will you refuse to humble yourself before Me?"
    - b) Consistent with obedience is humility. (Ex. 9.17; cf. Phil. 2.8; James 4.10)
  - 2. Through Moses, God issues an ultimatum.
    - a) **Exodus 10.4:** "Or else, if you refuse to let My people go..."
    - b) What was the consequence of his disobedience? (Ex. 10.4)
- B. The plague of locusts was sent "to your very heart" (Ex. 9.14).
  - 1. **Exodus 10.4:** The locusts would be pervasive.
  - 2. **Exodus 10.5:** The locusts would be destructive. (cf. Joel 1.4)
  - 3. Exodus 10.6: The locusts would be invasive. (cf. Ex. 8.13,21)
  - 4. **Exodus 10.6:** The locusts would be unrivaled. (cf. Ex. 9.18)
- C. Pharaoh still refused to let Israel go. (Ex. 10.7-11)
